My dear Madam

I have put off writing

 with it, however I am  
 to give it a fair trial  
 The Henry is quite well

 safe arrival in this  
 country she is much  
 delighted to feel herself

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once again evening here  
 our family - you seemed  
 to quite surprised at  
 her change to the King
