 - I am miserable about being to go as he has

 on the S. Sea; instead I mean some line  
 more easy, & he said Mr. B. letter was in  
 - about & that he would carry his point  
 - Since we cannot I have not seen him since  
 a minute & I suppose the letter will be  
 after the Council; what I wish was you should  
 have come forward it all went - Dear  
 let me know how far you are this evening  
 was sent down to the Harbour I was not able  
 down & then I might fly & sit with you -  
 You would see quite pleas about Savage  
 down back now the Belgium was that is also I  
 wish - as to the rest I believe he is right  
 also! the other one is united, but I wish they
