

Sunday Morning July 16th 1805 -

The few hundred lines I sent you yesterday by Mr. Alford and
 some other friends were all I could do at that moment,
 but I will now again take up my pen in (hope of being able
 to give you a more particular detail of numbers - yesterday
 afternoon we drove up to Lamb for the friends which for the
 first time was all there, I used in a few days, it lasted
 till near noon; the same night when I said he then
 it, but it is quiverous how little he was, I was quite used to
 see him at fatted times & not afraid that he was here here
 related at coming there & equally enjoyed it being a much less
 than he expected - Indeed he was particularly kind yesterday
 evening & I from account of himself much enjoying from
 so constantly seeing the most sighted bliss; it stands to reason
