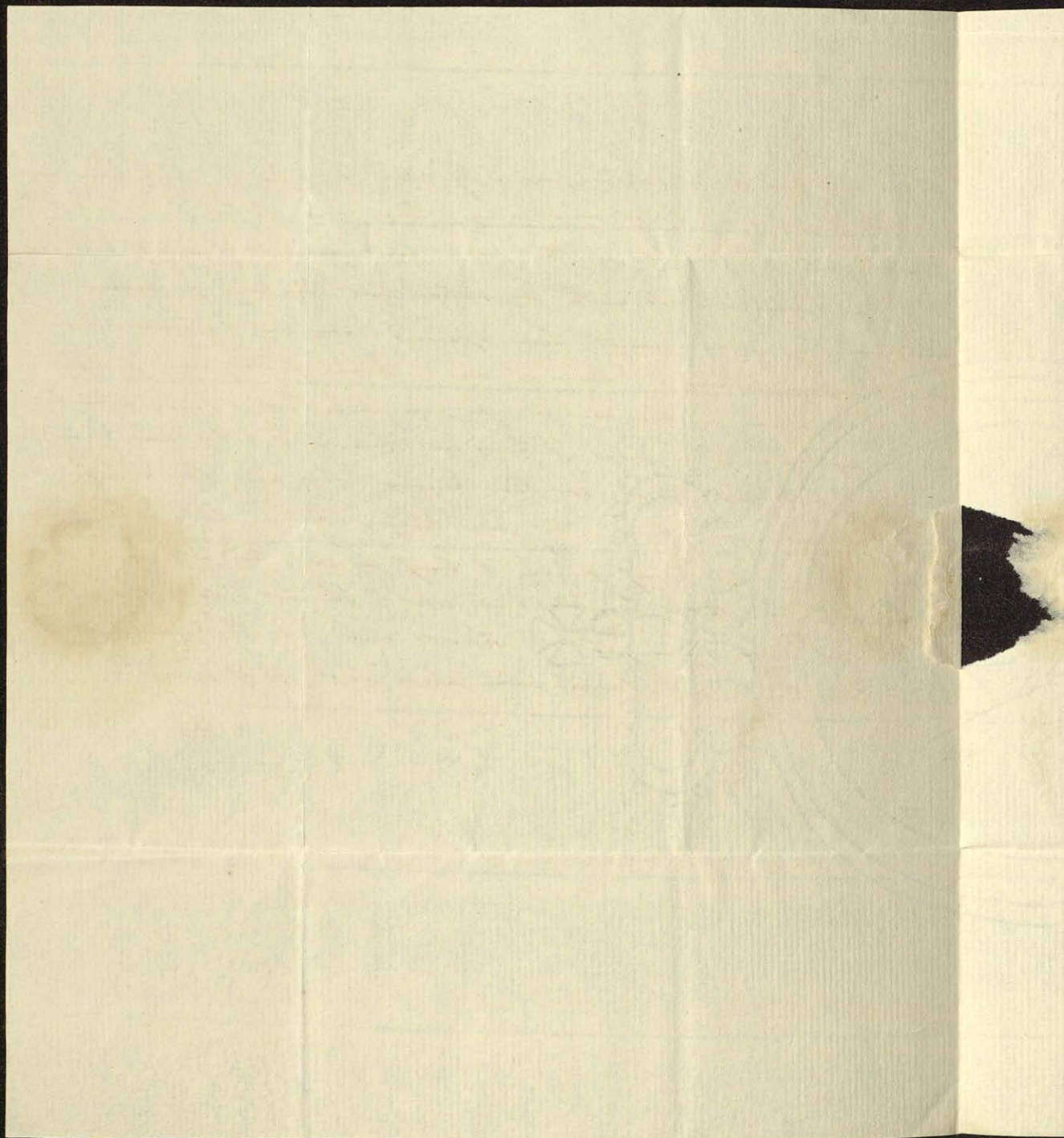
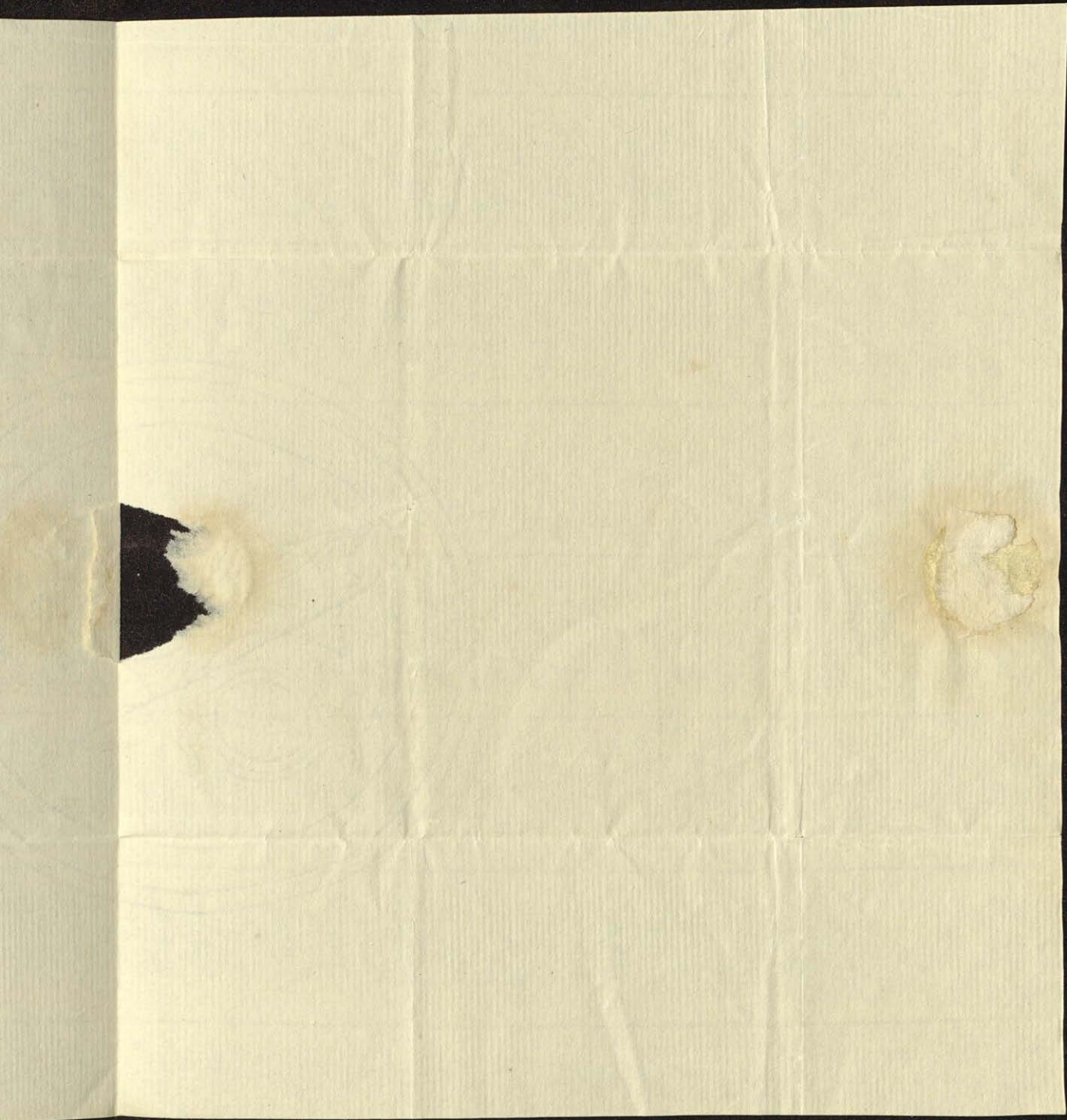


What a dear good kind creature you are by what Mrs. George has said concerning
