My Dear Mr. George

I am no sooner up than I hasten
to acquaint myself of any business of
writing to you - he arrived here
this morning rather before six after a
troublesome journey; the dear Angel
Mary was upon the whole well, but
said there had been some complaint
- kept to & to with by turban,
stand there till some few, there
