

Tuesday January 10th 1865 -

My dear dear & beloved friend

Since I dispatched mine of yesterday I absolutely feel in a
hurry from not knowing what you dear dear will think of me
& my dear, & so my heart has let me find a line on
my arrival in San Monday just to give me your dear -
I felt I need your dear after the manner in which you
have & warmly entered into all my concerns & that your dear
kindness is my dear believe me in the truth of my heart -
Let I feel dear & dear I see your dear for all
satisfaction: dear saying nothing but dear & saying: "well
she is wonderful"; do this I can give to a dear as my dear
will not make me dear the dear of my dear dear
at dear - I hope I should not be deemed dear in what I
have said before you; indeed if I be it is very very far diff.
- not from what I feel as I dear for I feel a dear that
when I feel a dear indulge the dear thought that you
- hope I can not give an dear of dear, the next I say
to myself "why do I dear myself there, for who can love
me - love for me" - This dear comes across me when I see what

I was well happy, though God knows it is not the same happiness
which I enjoyed formerly when my conscience did not torment
me - I ought not to fear for down down here, nor I. I know
it is a great fault; all yesterday evening as I was sitting by
myself I was thinking of you & longed to be here with
you, then I weighed & considered what you had thought of
me & comforted myself with recalling every every comfortable
circumstance we had had together when with your presence
you said that you could not blame me for being in favour
of another though in I. I. I was troubled to see me, but
that you blamed independence; so this comforted me & when
we meet I will say more, take then instance to be me
& remember for me must be as I am with you
& not for me being offended or such measure - I am glad
& allowed to share with the founder - I assure you that I
think of you much more & long to tell you by word of
mouth how much I am for you & joyful
