

Mr Pitt presents his compliments to Lady Charlotte Finch, and begs to acquaint the Ladyship for Her Majesty's Information that the House have again proceeded in a Committee on the Regency Bill. There have been three Divisions; the first on the Clause obliging the Treasury to issue in future the Sums necessary for the several Departments of the House hold, to any amount not exceeding that of the last year, which was carried as proposed by 132, to 87; the second on the subject of the Privy Purse, the greatest Part of which the Opposition proposed to

leave to the Regent, but this Proposal
was negatived and the original Clause
carried by 156 to 101.; the third, was
on the Clause respecting ~~the~~ Appointments
to the Household Offices, which was also
carried as proposed by 173 to 118. The
lateness of the Hour made it impossible
to proceed farther, but Mr Pitt sees no
Reason to doubt that the Decision of
the House will be equally favourable
tomorrow on the remaining Points in the
Bill.
