CAUTION.

THE Managers of the SUN FIRE-OFFICE having experienced very heavy Losses by REMOVALS, particularly at several recent Fires, and having also learnt that many Individuals have been considerable Sufferers, and sustained great Inconvenience from incautious, precipitate, and unnecessary Removals, do most earnestly recommend to all those who insure their Property in the Sun Fire Office, not to allow their Goods to be removed when a Fire breaks out in the Neighbourhood, unless it should have reached so near as to be within one or two Houses of their Residence, or advised to do so by a Fireman.

The Managers also recommend that persons insured with them will not suffer Strangers to enter their Houses in Cases of Alarm, except where the Fire shall break out in their own Premises, or shall have reached within *one or two Doors of their Residence.*

hath paid the Sum of Two Pounds Eleven Shillings & Sixpence to the Society of the SUN FIRE-OFFICE in London, and has agreed to pay, or cause to be paid, to them, at their said Office, the Sum of Two Pounds Eleven Shillings & Sixpence on the twenty fourth of June 1810 and the like Sum of Two Pounds Eleven Shillings & Sixpence yearly, on the twenty fourth of June during the Continuance of this Policy, for Insuranc from Loss or Damage by Fire, on his Household Goods, printed Books, Wearing Apparel & Plate in his new Dwelling House only, situate as aforesaid not exceeding Seventeen hundred Pounds China & Glass therein only not exceeding fifty Pounds Household Goods, printed Books, Wearing Apparel & Plate in Trust therein only, not exceeding Five hundred Pounds Coachhouse & Stable adjoining behind not exceeding Two hundred & fifty Pounds All which

Now, know ye, That, from the Date of these Presents, and so long as the said shall duly pay, or cause to be paid, the said Sum of Two Pounds Eleven Shillings & Sixpence at the Times and Place aforesaid; and the Trustees or acting Members of the said Society, for the Time being, shall agree to accept the same; the Stock and Fund of the said Society shall be subject and liable to pay to the said Jacob & Pude' his Executors, Administrators, and Assigns, all such his Damage and Loss which he the said Jacob & Pude' shall suffer by Fire, not exceeding the Sum of Two thousand Five hundred Pounds, according to the exact Tenor of their printed Proposals, dated July the 7th, 1808, and of an Act of Parliament, of the 44th of GEORGE the Third, for charging a Duty on Persons whose Property shall be insured against Loss by Fire. In Witness whereof, we (Three of the Trustees or acting Members for the said Society) have hereunto set our Hands and Seals, the twentieth Day of June 1809.
