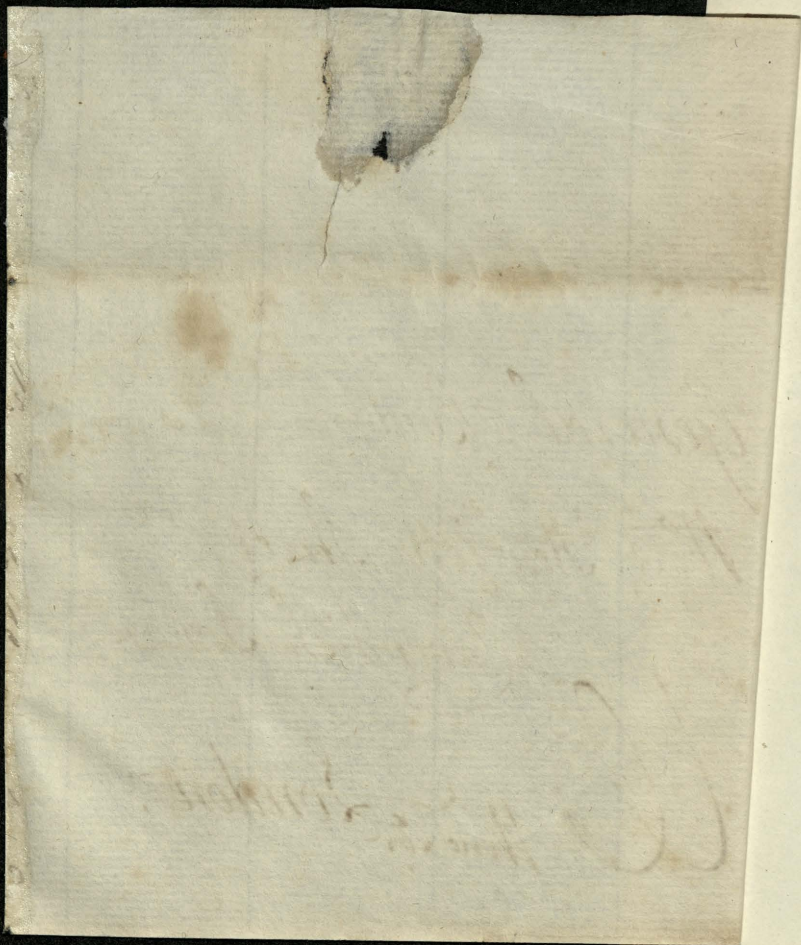

We shall never be able to make you Amends for your Goodness:  
I heartily wish we could. My Wife has not enjoyed her Health  
since the Decease of her Daughter. I received the Sum of Seventy  
Five Pounds and Thirteen Shillings last Wednesday from the  
Sturminster and Dorsetshire Bank, which I understand is the  
last Payment, on Account of my late Daughter's Effects, &c. My
