

Mr. Col. H. Taylor to Dr. Vaughan

Weymouth August 25th 1795

Sir,

I have had the honor of submitting to His Majesty your letter of yesterday and the enclosed accounts of His Royal Highness the Duke of Gloucester's state. I request you will have the goodness to present My Duty to Prince William and to enquire, A. N. B., that His Majesty received with very evident satisfaction this more comfortable Report, but that although happy to hear that the symptoms had become more favourable and that the Duke of Gloucester had been in some measure restored, His Majesty does not allow himself as yet to indulge hopes of His Royal Highness's Recovery which he is sensible that His Situation continues so precarious.
