GREETING.

WHEREAS We have thought fit to give Our Assent to an Act of the Legislature of Our Province of Nova-Scotia, entitled an Act to empower the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in Chief of Our said Province, to appoint Sheriffs in such Counties where it may be found necessary, We reposing Special Trust and Confidence in your Loyalty, Integrity and Ability, have nominated, constituted and appointed, and by these Presents Do Nominate, Constitute and Appoint you the said *William Brown Hulme Esqr* Sheriff of the County of *Sydney*, in Our said Province. TO HAVE, HOLD and EXERCISE the said Office, or place unto you the said *William Brown Hulme* by yourself or your sufficient Deputy or Deputies, (for whom you shall be answerable) for and during the Term of One Year, or until another shall be appointed, in your stead, you the said *William Brown Hulme* being resident in said County and to be Subject to all such Laws, Customs, Ordinances, Regulations and Directions, as the High Sheriffs in the several Counties in the Kingdom of England, are Subject to, and shall also be Subject to all such Acts of the Province aforesaid, which in any way or manner do or shall relate to the Execution of the Office of Sheriff or Provost Marshall. AND WE DO hereby empower and authorize you to receive and enjoy all and singular the Rights, Salaries, Allowances, Fees, Profits, Priviledges and Emoluments to the said Office belonging and appertaining in your said County, requiring you hereby faithfully and deligently to discharge the Duties of said Office as becometh. IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF We have caused the Seal of Our said Province to be hereunto affix'd. WITNESS Our Trusty and Wellbelov'd *John Wentworth Esqr*, Lieutenant Governor & Commander in Chief in and over Our Province of Nova-Scotia, and its Dependencies, Vice Admiral of the same &c. &c. &c. at Halifax this *Twelfth* Day of *June* in the Year of Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred and *Ninetytwo* in the *Thirtysecond* Year of Our Reign. *Wentworth.*
