This last is a very remarkable clock from the circumstance

circumstance of its having been made at the Observatory in Richmond Gardens under the immediate direction of His Majesty King George the 3<sup>d</sup>. The teeth of the wheels were cut in an engine made expressly for that purpose.

Smith did not live to finish the clock, & it was completed (with the exception of the pendulum) by the late B. Vulliamy clock maker to His Majesty King George the 3<sup>d</sup>, who made the escapement & the suspension for the pendulum. Smith had projected and partly made a knife edge suspension which wholly failed. The clock has hitherto gone with a temporary two second pendulum, composed of thin iron bars.

Probably the best pendulum that could be applied to the clock would be one composed of a wood rod and cast iron bob.

This clock is exceedingly well made, & a most beautiful specimen of the art of clock making.
