Our Will and Pleasure is, That
You pay or cause to be paid unto Richard
Ireland, Upholder, the Yearly Sume of Fifty
pounds, in lieu of Bills, for Work to be done
by him for Our Service, the same to comence
from the Twenty fifth day of Dec^r last past,
and from thence to be paid Quarterly at
the four most usual Feasts or Terms in the
Year (Viz^t) Lady-day, Midsummer, Michas,
& Christmas by equal Portions during Our
Pleasure, And for so doing this being
first enter'd with Our Audit Gen^l and
Debentures issued pursuant therunto, shall
be as well to you for payment, as to Our said
Aud^l Gen^l for Allowance thereof on your
Acco^t a sufficient Warrant. Given at
Richmond the Eleventh day of Sept^r 1718
in the Fifth Year of the Reign of Our Royal
Father the King
