London. Jan. 25<sup>th</sup>. 1803

The King has this morning received  
 our Secretary Zucke's Note accompanied  
 by the Letter from the Earl of Derby enclosing  
 the Application of the Colonels of the Regiments  
 of Lancashire & Cheshire that they may  
 be allowed in future to bear in their  
 Colours of their respective Regiments,  
 the Red Rose, the Ancient Badge of the  
 County Palatine. The Seal worn by  
 this Corps, of the same form & Personal  
 Attachment of that County, to the King's  
 Person makes Him most willingly  
 consent to this Distinction, which  
 they most fully deserve.
