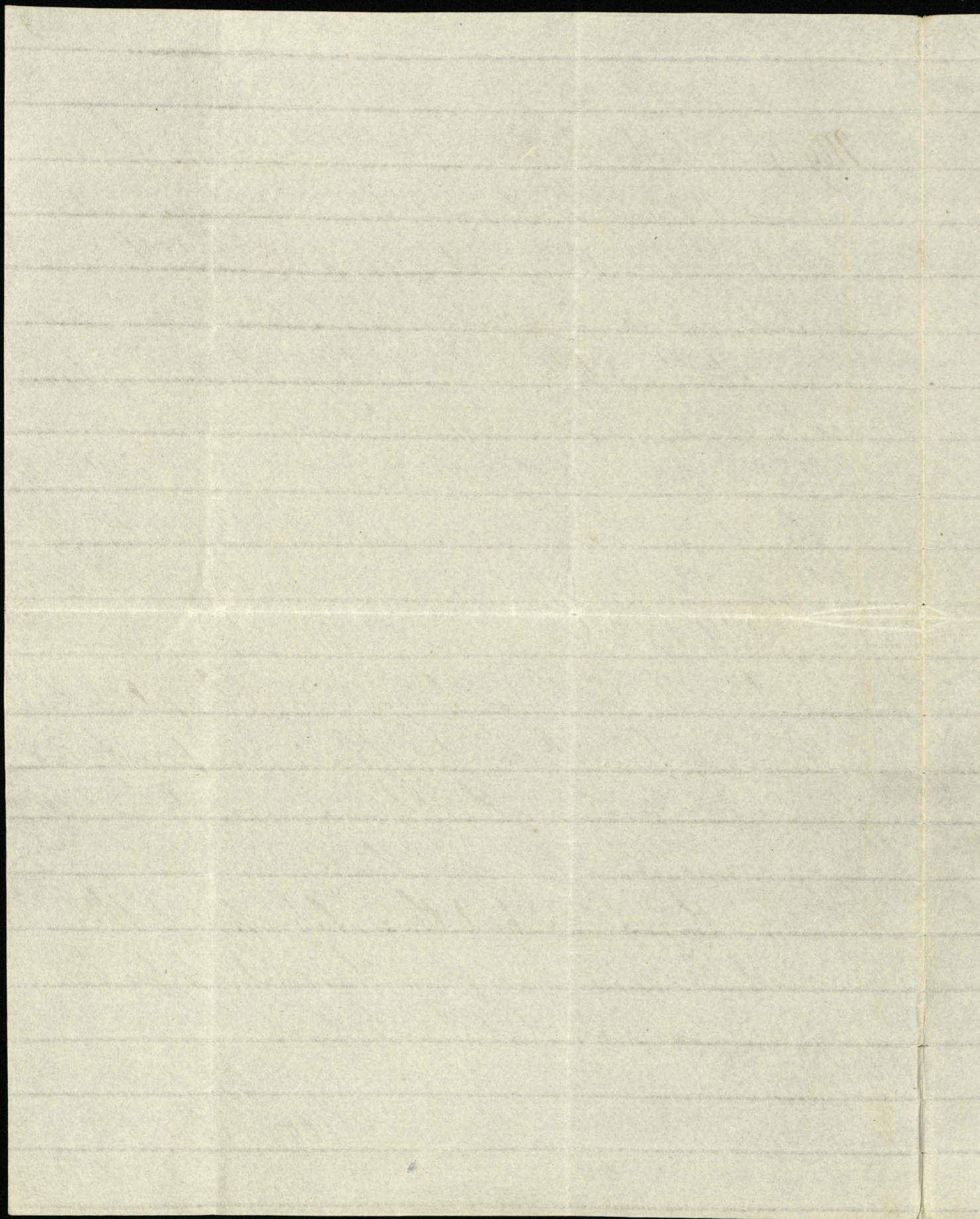
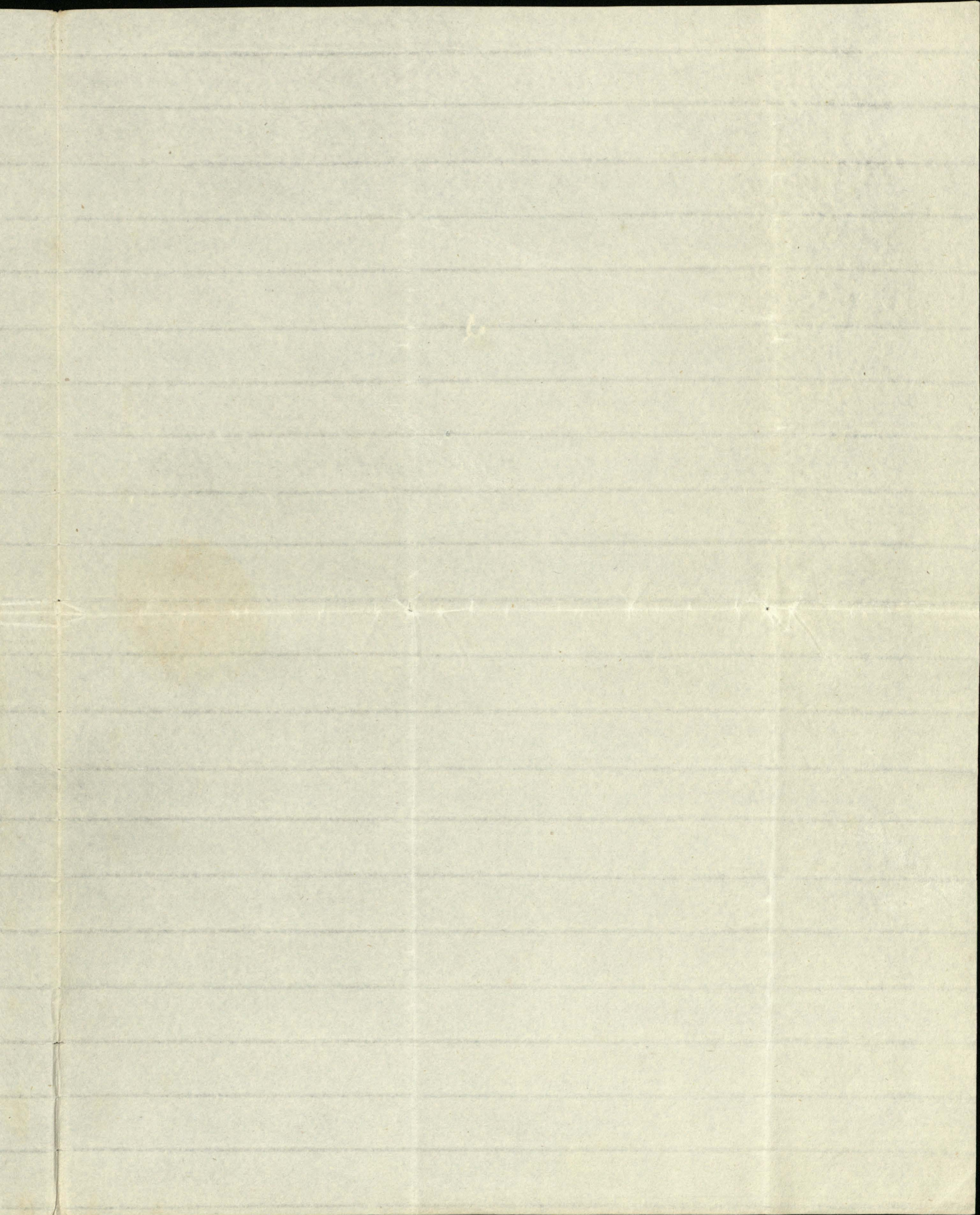


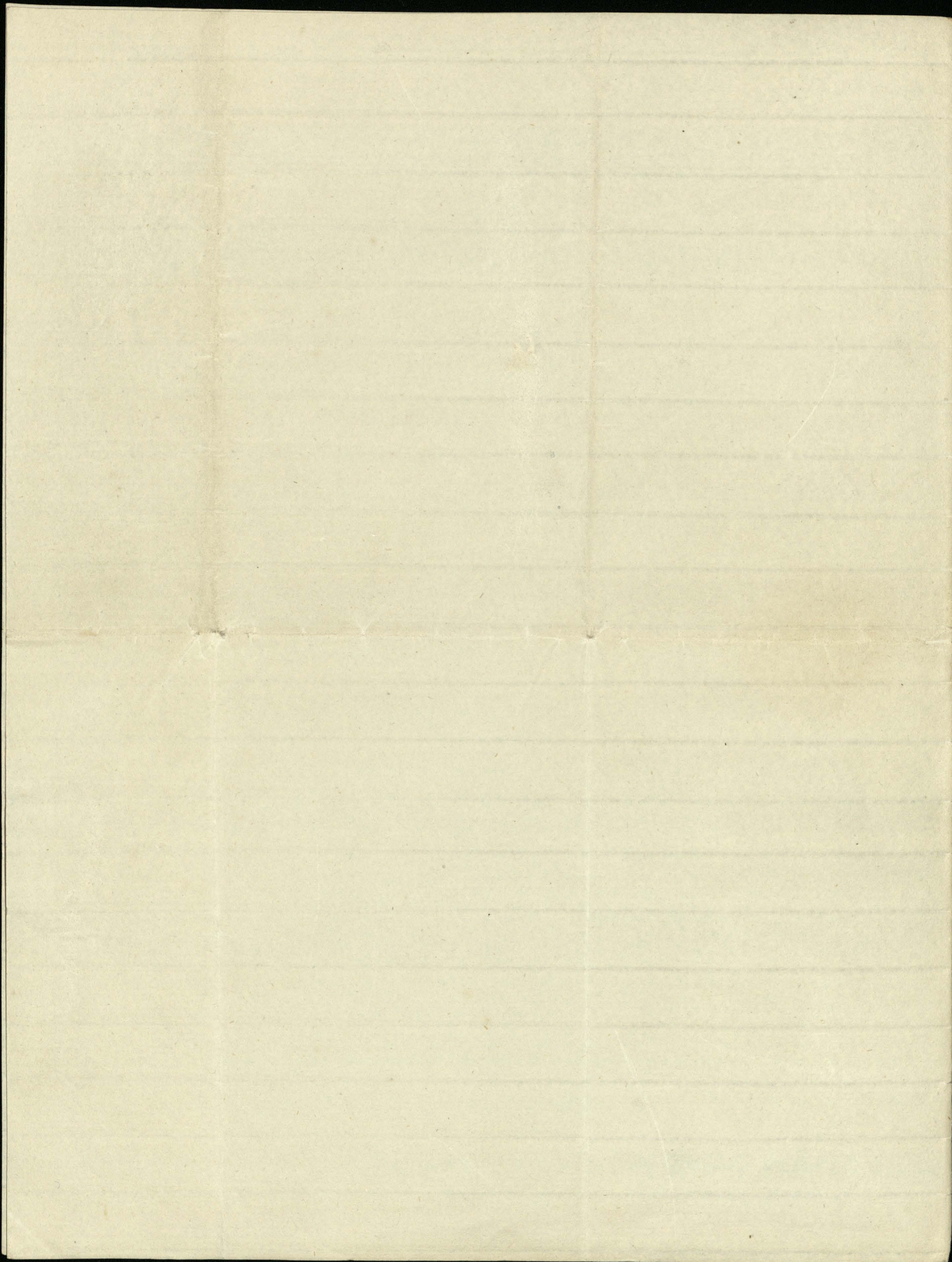
My Good Lord, The humanity which is not among the least
