Dear Greenwood

Inclosed I send You a draft upon the
Paymaster General for two thousand seven
hundred and twenty pounds, at forty day sight
that I desire that You will be so good as to
receive and place to my account.

This is my pay up to the 25 of December as
taken from my Public Money up to the 28th of this
month and my two thousand days Ball and
Ferry money I explain this to You but You might
suppose that its being so large a sum that
I had had a free will the Dutch Burse.

We begin embarking a part of the Troops
tomorrow, as fast as Transports arrive the Dutch

will follow, I shall leave the place for the children
to superintend the embarkation tomorrow, How soon
however I shall be able to embark myself for England
I can not as yet say or I should depend upon the
means of getting every thing off, I hope however
that it will not be long.
