My Dear Greenwood,

I had the pleasure of receiving your kind letter yesterday evening & I lost no time in communicating it to the Princess Sophia, who has expressed herself to be deeply sensible of your kind & ready attention to her wishes & has desired me to send you the enclosed letter in which she says she has endeavoured to thank you. She observed that you had not only made her very happy by thus affording to her the immediate means of assisting the Duke of York but had also relieved her from the embarrassment of resorting to others who have not the same motive for preserving secrecy, and had gratified her not a little by the confidence with which you have agreed to the arrangement she proposed. - Mrs. A. G. desires me to add that she expects the Duke here
on

on Saturday after which she will be able to let you know when
 she may wish to receive the £5000, and that she will be
 obliged to you to have the Bond prepared as you describe
 it, of which I shall witness the signature. The Installments
 will be regularly paid to you thro' me & the Interest also
 for each Quarter in proportion to the principal remaining
 due after each Payment, which would make the first Payment
 £562. 10 " the next 556. 5 & so on

Thro' my Obedience to the Princess's
 Commands I must now, my dear Greenwood thank
 you most sincerely for so kindly considering my Concern
 in this Transaction, but at the same time express a hope
 that if a more prompt Reimbursement should tend to the
 Convenience of any of the Parties concerned you will
 not scruple to admit what I had proposed about after

when we could make the smallest difference in my arrangements
