24<sup>th</sup> May 1794

Dear Greenwood,

It has just occur'd to me that  
You may be of very essential service to me  
& perhaps in consequence to Yourself, at this  
particular moment; I hurried out of Town  
so quickly with my head so full of every thing  
that has pass'd upon the Continent, as well as with  
an Interview I had this Morning that I totally forgot  
to send to desire You to call upon me. Perhaps  
You will think me very unreasonable in desiring

You to come to Brighton, should it be attended  
with any very material inconvenience, I remain  
with you should come & I will on my return  
you go the next day, you will find the business  
papers, & delay may entirely undo all our plans.
