Dear Greenwood.

As You in a hurry I am oblig'd
to address myself to You in a couple of hurried
Lines, being oblig'd to set off in a hurry
for Buzgate, the place of embarkation
being chang'd to that place, & I am setting
off without a Guinea in my Pocket, I
send my valet with this Letter & you
will follow me down when he receives
the money from your hands. If You hear
or should that I am gone there, say that

That you know some difficulties had arisen
as to the relative to the embarkation
of the Princess coming over, the place of
sailing from being changed which should
be said by immediate presence, and
this she says, I am also assured
