Whereas William Weightman was at a Special Session of Oyer and Terminer and Gaol Delivery, holden at Derby, in and for the County of Derby, on the 16th day of October last, indicted for High Treason to which Indictment he pleaded Guilty, and had Sentence passed upon him to be drawn on a Scaffold to the Place of Execution and to be there hanged by his Neck until he be dead, and afterwards his Head severed from his Body, and his Body to be divided into four Parts, and to be disposed of as we should direct, but afterwards received Our Pardon on condition of his being

Imprisoned in the Gaol of the said County
for One Year. We in consideration of some
favorable Circumstances humbly
represented unto Us in his behalf
are graciously pleased to Extend Our
still further Grace and Mercy unto
him, and to Remit unto him such
part of the said Term of Imprisonment
as remains yet to be undergone
and performed; Our will and
Pleasure therefore is, that You cause
him the said William Weightman,
to be forthwith discharged out of
Custody. — And for so doing this shall
be Your Warrant. — Given at Our
Court at Carlton House, the Fourth
day of May 1818, in the Fifty
eighth Year of Our Reign. —

To Our Trusty and Wellbeloved, Our
Justices named in the Special Commission
of Oyer and Terminer and Gaol
Delivery for Our County of Derby
by virtue whereof the abovesaid
Commission was holden. We High
Sheriff of the County of Derby, and
all others whom it may concern.
