Our Will and Pleasure is that by Virtue of our
General Letters of Privy Seal bearing date the 5th day
of November 1760 You do give and pay or cause to be
given and paid out of any Our Treasure or Revenue
in the Receipt of the Exchequer applicable to the
Use of Our Civil Government unto Our most
dearly beloved Son George Prince of Wales or to his
Treasure for the Time being for his Use the Sum
of Ten Thousand Two Hundred Pounds without
Account towards defraying the Expenses attending
the Works carrying on at Carlton House And
for so doing this shall be your Warrant Given
at Our Court at Saint James' this 21st day of May
1789 In the Twenty ninth Year of Our Reign
