
Dear Sir,

With the papers of instant came
as they might last night get. Yours of 13th did not
find time. I have in consequence written to
Barton to go to the Foreign Office on this morn-
ing neglecting to now mention the fact to you
that you may imagine it a negligence however
between Henry Moore and Charles Hall. Till
Friday I cannot again expect to have further
to hear from you.
Till Bfphk it to run over the way & post and

rails to be fixed along the river bank in the
River field as soon as the hay is off and not to force
the horses and stock to return in the different
fields as soon as the horses have got home
admit. The stock in the West-Fronton stalls
became ill. Remoatler is here to look after
a place in England you will never know: however
a dry warm summer does not stand for me
good. The horses shall have their place on ^{the} 10
July in high heat and fine its and leave me
