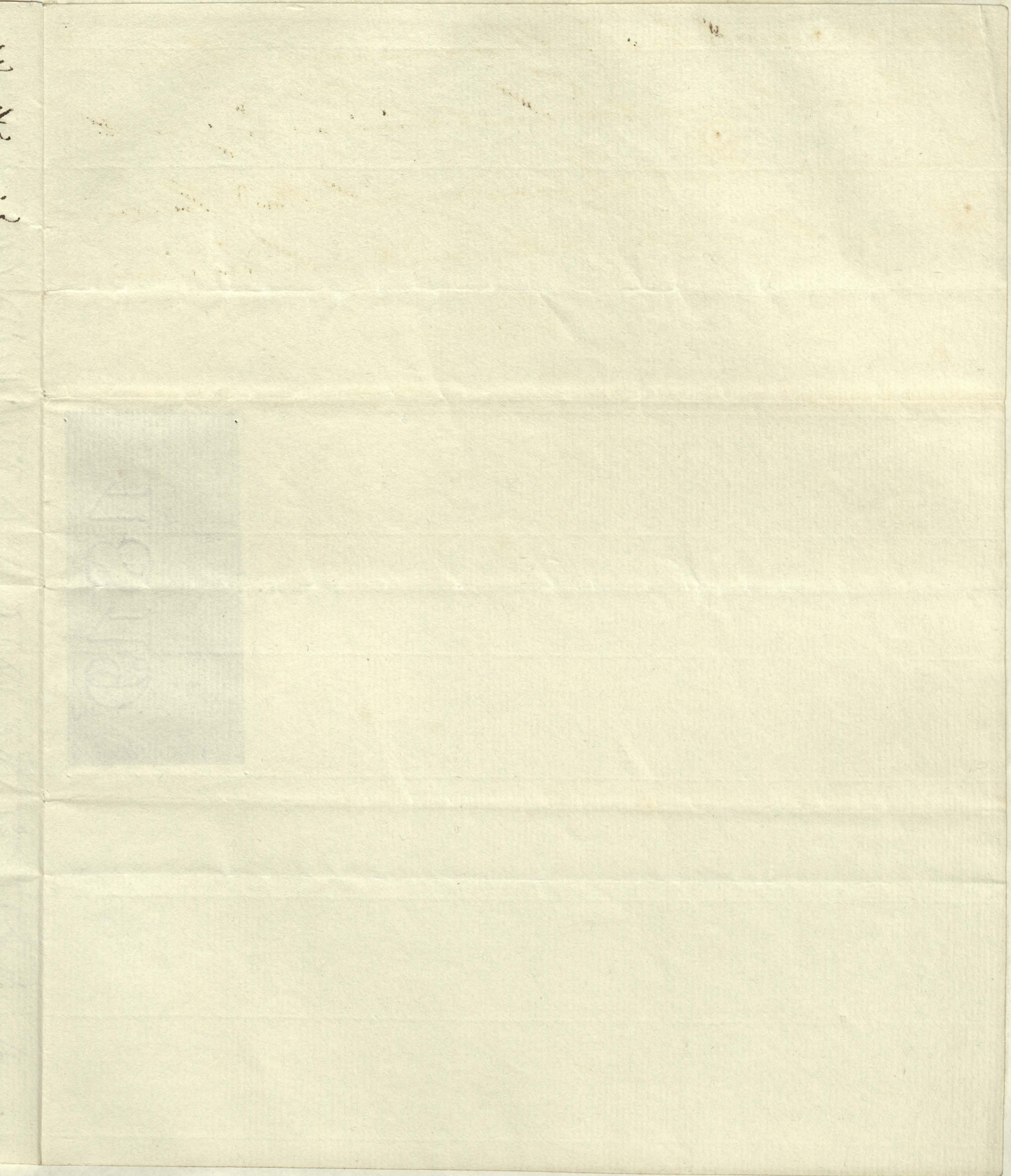


Walmers.
