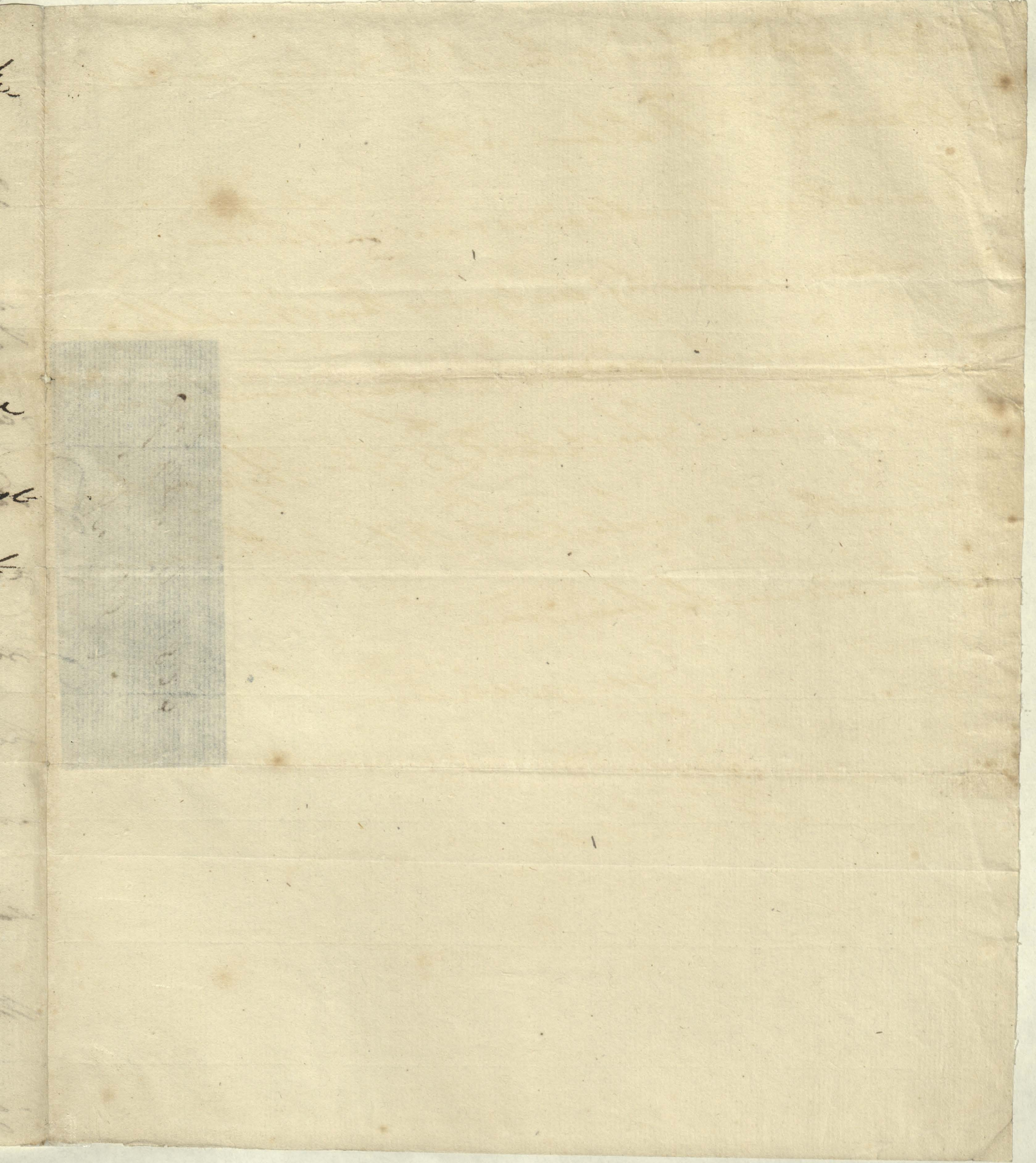
Dear Daniell,
