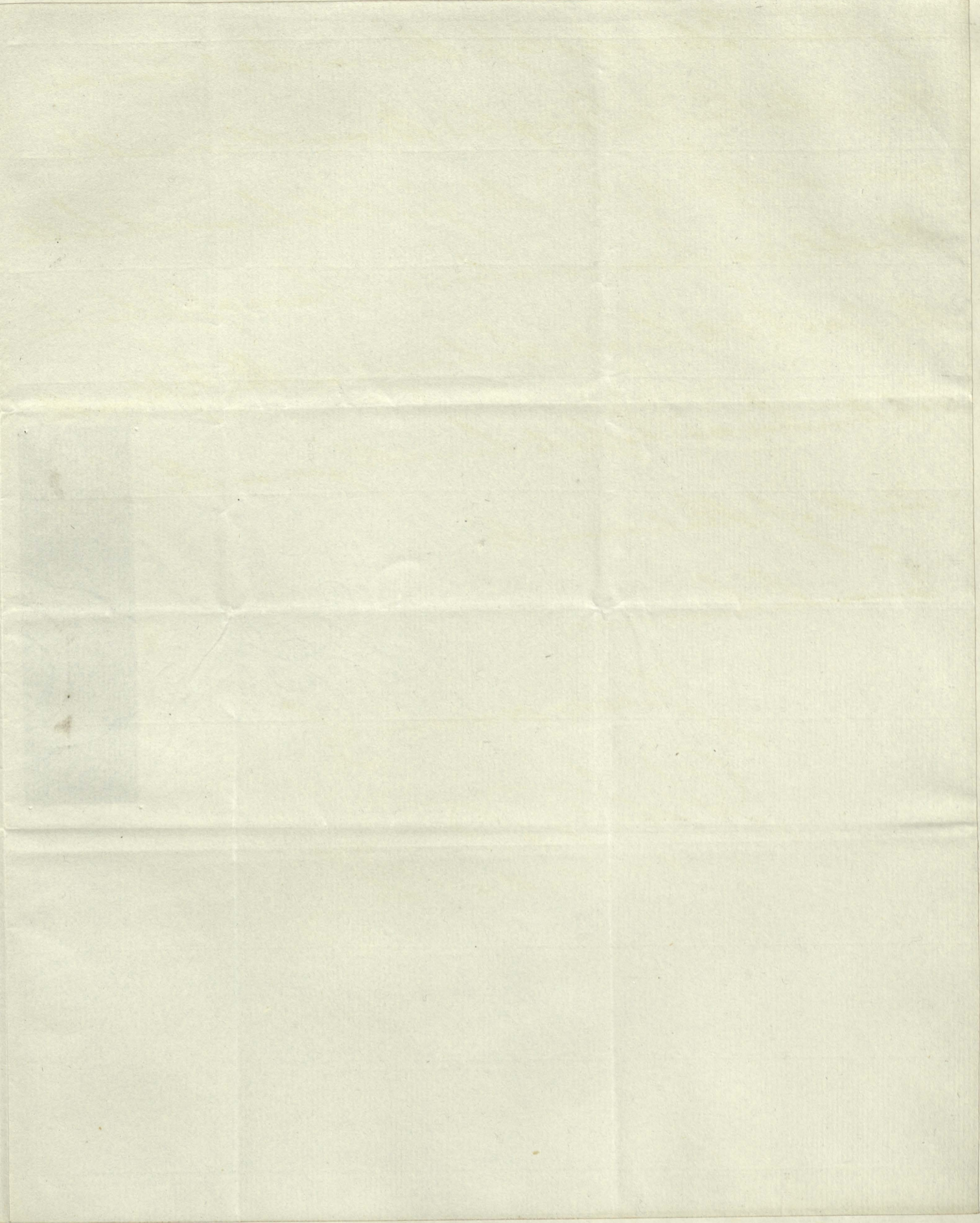
Dear Sir, Yesterday having the same Jews of 23^d

which I have properly signed.

I never thought C. Beechey Messer was in Peabody-
ton Parish the 'Dinnington's Lodge and the Sun-
day maybe. I thought the last Powell has been
so properly punished. Unless, later the hunger
is very much changed I am astonished for: I
never should have interested himself for his elec-
tion as Governor. Under the existing circumstances of
the Board of War the I thought so much has been done
to the Messer. I am ever your
Winehouse and Bank.
