 Aug<sup>th</sup> 27: 1825.

Dear Sir,  
 Just today I received from <sup>the</sup> 15  
 instant with its revenues enclosed and return  
 the proper papers signed. I likewise send a letter  
 and paper from the Quaker Loan Saving Bank  
 which I will enclose into my return which  
 will now be so soon that no inconvenience can  
 arise from this delay.

I am very glad all has been done at the Upper Lodge  
 agreeable to the wishes of George and that you will  
 have Beesby House ready by the first week in  
 September. The man recommended by Tritton  
 and Co. may have paid in leaving the Beesby house  
 for the present was more than sufficient of his property.
