on Horseback & Mr.
Davis very properly
advised me to take
Shower Baths frequently

which have done me a great
deal of good & I really
feel the better for them
& hope soon to be entirely
free from all complaints
as the wash is much
less troublesome now.
I am happy to hear so
good an account of your
own self & trust that you
will continue well during
the rest of the Winter
& a long long period after-
wards. I also hope that
your little Gial is quite
recovered & that all your

Family is as well as you
can wish them to be. —
The King, thank God, is
well, & his health is looking
unusually well too, & his
latter part of his life
has been most agreeable
to the Queen which Sir M.
She has been painting of
him for the Dublin Castle
