Executors and Universal Delegates in Trust who have renounced as well the Probate and execution thereof as also
 Letters of Administration with the will annexed of all and singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of the said deceased
 and we being serious that the said Goods Chattels and Credits may be well and faithfully administered applied and disposed
 of according to Law so therefore by these presents grant full power and authority to you in whose fidelity we confide to administer
 and faithfully dispose of the said Goods Chattels and Credits according to the tenor and effect of the said will and first to pay the
 debts of the said deceased which he did owe at the time of his death and afterwards the debts contained and specified in the
 said will so far as such Goods Chattels and Credits will thereto extend and the Law requires you the said **Thomas Pitt** and
Nugent Kirkland having been already sworn and you the said **William Allen** having first made a solemn and sincere
 declaration or affirmation according to Act of Parliament well and faithfully to administer the same and to make a true
 and perfect Inventory of all and singular the said Goods Chattels and Credits and to exhibit the same into the Registry of our
 Prerogative Court of Canterbury on or before the last day of September next ensuing and also to render a just and true account
 thereof and we do by these presents ordain and constitute you **Administrators** of all and singular the Goods Chattels
 and Credits of the said deceased with the said will annexed. Her Royal Highness **Victoria Duchess of Kent**
 and **Strathearn** widow the executrix of the deceased and one of the Universal Delegates named in the said will having first
 renounced the Letters of Administration with the said will annexed of all and singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of the
 said deceased in known right and also as the sole **Guardian** appointed in and by the said will to the Princess
Alexandrina Victoria an infant the natural and lawful daughter and only child of the said deceased and the other
 Universal Delegate named in the said will **Given at London** the twenty first day of March in the year of our Lord one
 thousand eight hundred and twenty and in the sixteenth year of our **Translation**.

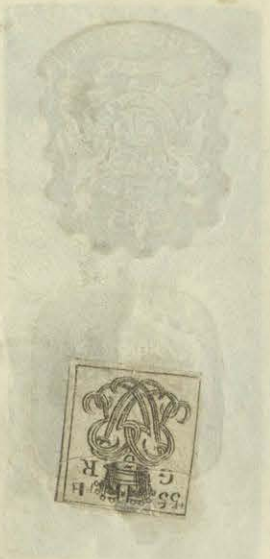
