Dear Sir,

as I surmised this is the diary of Prince Edward, afterwards Duke of Kent, and father of the Queen. Mr. B is his governor J. B. Myeres; and Capt Green was his instructor in mathematics. The date is 1784. This is ascertained by Handel's centenary and good Friday occurring on the 9th of April.
