I have seen Mr. Denbigh, who tells me that the Country Gentlemen were at first hurt they were not supported in defending Dr. Hoeb, but that now they are appeas'd. You ought to consider of the best mode of rejecting Mr. Fred. Montague's proposition of no longer keeping the 30<sup>th</sup> of January.

Your having seen all Manuscripts will I hope enable you to give good advice to the Lords this Evening for the Management of tomorrow's Debate and whatever is agreed upon will I hope be decid'd for altering the mode of proceeding when in the House never answers. I hope shall either from you or one of the Secretaries receive a line concerning what papers, even to night for you may guess how much I am anxious to see this measure well carried through
