Lord North has the honour of informing
his Majesty, that Mr Eden having come
over this morning to Busby, & brought
with him, Mr de Vergennes's Letters to the
Duke of Argyllton, Lord North has, in the
absence of Lord Suffolk & Lord Rochford, ventured
to advise Mr Eden to send over by a
messenger, to Mr John Goodricke, Mr de
Vergennes's second Letter, by which it appears
that the K. of Sweden's plan of altering
the Swedish Constitution by force is
laid aside. Lord North ^{thinks} ~~thinks~~ that it
is desirable that Mr John Goodricke should

receive the second letter at the same
time ^{with} as the first or as soon after as
possible, least he should in consequence of
the first letter embark in measures which
the alteration of the ^{St.} of Sanders's
plan would render improper or unne-
-cessary.
