He received Lord Sturmer's letters from Lord Rochford today, & returns, in answer, that he thought the first question was how far the Trade at Dunkirk was a breach of Treaty; that Treaty must certainly be observed, but, if our treaty rights are not affected, the Ships carrying out Dunkirk did not appear to him North to be in them.
