Having had the honour of your Lordship's friendship relative to the favour I have requested of his Majesty, & your Lordship having mention'd the Name of Mr. Vernon, I take the Liberty of enclosing two Letters from Mr. Warburton which I have found amongst my Father's papers;

Tho' these Letters will shew your Lordship what Opinion Mr. Warburton had of the Vernon-claim, still my whole dependance is upon your Lordship's good Offices in my Behalf, & the favour I hope to receive from his Majesty's kindness towards me.

I need not trouble your Lordship with

Opportunity of convincing your Lordship of
my Gratitude for any favour that may
be shewn me, & in exerting my Zeal at all
times in the Support of his Majesty's Government.
