

- No: 1. A Star given by Queen Anne to Prince George of Denmark.
- No: 2. 40 Buttons, some of the best, 12, or 20, was purchased by the late King himself, some of them were taken out of a George given by St. William to King George the 1<sup>st</sup>. Some of them were taken out of a George given by Queen Anne to King George the 2<sup>d</sup>. Some given by Will to King George the 1<sup>st</sup> by Princess Sophia; The rest were given to the late King by the Dutchess of Zell.
- No: 3. 12. Rings all bought by the late King.
- No: 4. A George. It is Imagin'd that four of the Diamonds were the Dutchess of Zells Carrings left to the late King by Will, all the rest were bought.
- No: 5. The two great Diamonds in the Agraffe came to the late King, from King George the 1<sup>st</sup> who had them from his Mother, the two Tops & some of the small ones were purchased.
