To execute the Office of Almoner and to have certain fees viz! The Silver Alms Bason and the Distribution of all the Silver therein with the fine Linnen Towel and the Distribution of all the Cloth spread on the ground on which the Kings Walks with a Sun of time

Preferred to the King to appoint which of them he think fit to perform the said Office and as for the fees the Silver Alms Dish only is allowed to such person as shall do the Duty and the same person is to distribute the Cloth among the poor according to Customs

Bishop of Durham & Bishop of Bath & Wells.

To Support the King at the Coronation in the Procession

Allowed

Lord Spawen as Lord of the Manor of Great Wyntonley in the Shire of Northampton

To serve the King on the day of his Coronation with the first cup of Silver gilt out of which the King shall drink at Dinner and to have the cup for his fee

William Nailor Esquire as seized in fee of the Baronry of Bedford

Comer claimed said Office

The Dean & Chapter of Ely

To instruct the King in the rights and ceremonies used at the Coronation and to assist the Archbishop in performing divine Services and to have the Keeping of the Coronation Robes with robes fees &c

Allowed except as to the Keeping of the Robes which are adjudged to be there kept unless the King shall order them elsewhere and the fees referred to the Kings pleasure

Sir Peter Seame Bar! as Lord of the Manor of Harpenden in Essex

To have the Bason and ewer to the King by virtue of one moiety of the Manor and the Towel by the other

Allowed only as to the Towel

Richard Wheloc Esq as Lord of the Isle of Man

To present the King on the day of his Coronation with two falcons

Allowed

Earl of Sussex

To carry the Great Spurs before the King

Allowed

Bishops of the Cinque Ports

To support the canopy and have the Staves and Bells for their fees and to Dine at the Table on the Kings right Hand and to have cloth for Vesture at the Kings Expence

Allowed except as to the Cloth for Vesture

Lord Abingdon as seized in fee of the Manor of Scoulton in Dorset

To be Chief Swarder to the King

Preferred to the King to appoint which of them he think fit

Lord Maynard as seized of the Manor of Epstet in Essex

Comer claimed s. Office

Duke of Norfolk as Lord of the Manor of Wrotham in Nottinghamshire

To find the King a right Hand glove and to support his Arm whilst he holds the Scepter

Allowed and Preferred to the King to appoint a Deputy

Duke of Norfolk as Lord of the Manor of Arundel and elsewhere of the Manor of Henninghall in Dorset

To perform by Deputy the Office of Chief Butler of England and to have for his fees a Lute Bason and ewer with several other things

Allowed with the fees of a Cup and ewer and referred to the King to appoint a Deputy

William Campbell Esq as Lord of the Manor of Linton in Essex

To serve the King with wafers

Sir John Aust as the Carver to the King

To be Carver to the King
