Dear William, The affection I have uninterruptedly
shewn you & Henry, & which you have both
constantly returned, makes me thoroughly certain
that you will both be glad of having a public
opportunity of shewing the love you bear me,
the numbers of attenders in the House of Lords
tomorrow will probably be pretty near, it is
therefore of great Personal consequence to
me that the Majority should not alone be
produced by Proxies, I desire you will
communicate this to Henry, that I may have both
your assistance on this occasion, the Opposition
give out Edward is to vote with them but
I cannot credit it, yet that prevents my
writing to him, for if he declined that could not
