sent Me when the Appraisement
was made.

I shall not purchase any of the Jewels
I should not chuse to have any
express mention made of the Public
sale of the Jewels of this having
belonged to my late Mother.

I am desirous of having Lists of
the Trinkets, the rest of the Public
ought also to have Lists, I have
reason to think my Sisters will
chuse to keep these Articles.

I enclose the Keys of the Boxes
that contain the Trinkets at the
Bank, that they may be appraised
as proposed at Lord Boston's House
Now at the Queens House were
reappraised on the 11th and the
Plate and China on the 15th of
which I should likewise chuse
to have Lists the other Parties
ought only to have it of the Plate
that has either the Arms or Cypher
of my late Mother, the Dresden
Service belonged to My late
Father therefore should not be
entered in the Lists to be sent to
the rest of the Family.

The Lists signed by Lord
Rochford, Lord Boston and Mr.
Legrand are also enclosed.

The Furniture of Carlton House
and of Brunswick House will
certainly take at the Appraisal
value, and therefore wish to have
a List of it.
