Two very full conversations with Sir Robert Keith have given me the greatest comfort as they have confirm'd the opinion that your heart is the same as when you left your native Country; I find you have a desire of having some of the Hannoverian Musicians attend at the Goehorde, in consequence of which the necessary ^{orders} will be by this night's post given, as also my directions that M^{rs} de Peze be invited to attend you; she is certainly a Woman of good principles and I can never have any objection to her in my Dominions; when formerly about you it arose from her known attachment to those given up to French Politics. She can perhaps recommend persons settled in my Dominions that may be fit Ladies to belong to you; indeed she and M^{rs} de Herpes are the properest persons to point out ^{those} best ^{qualified} persons, and I doubt not but they would readily undertake that task. Dear Sister continue that circumspection in your behaviour that has gain'd great credit during your misfortunes it is the most
affectional

effectual means of shewing what a blessing you might have
been if those that had surrounded you had possessed any principle
of honour and integrity. I understand you wish to have a small
library composed of English, German and French books as to
the two last languages my old acquaintance Jung has offered
to supply you when he shall know on what subjects you
would choose ^{them} I shall certainly procure those in English
as soon as you send me the like notice
