Packed must go on Saturday June 19<sup>th</sup> to Portsmouth to see every thing prepared for the Horses.

On Sunday June 20<sup>th</sup> Figgates 9 Horses and one of Sanders with the Six Bay Horses for the Equerries Post Coach, the 4 Hobby Grooms, the four footmen on their Horses, and their Helper on a fifth to go to Godalmin.

On Monday June 21<sup>st</sup> they are to proceed towards Portsmouth <sup>except</sup> four of Figgates Horses with one of the Hobby Grooms to remain at Godalmin till Tuesday June 22<sup>d</sup> and then go to Over the Heath about four Miles the rest to go to Petersfield.

On the same day five of Hainsworth's Horses to go to Ripley, and one of the Hobby Grooms.  
On Tuesday June 22<sup>d</sup> The King's Chaise to be drawn from New to Ripley by four of Sanders's Horses Williams and the Postilion of the left to ride, Stagman on one of the Footmen's Hacks to attend instead of a Hobby Groom; two of the Footmen to ride on Hacks to be hired at Richmond; the Horses to return after bathing from Ripley to New.

At Ripley four of Hainsworth's Horses to draw the Chaise the same Postillions and Helper to contain this stage, one of the Hobby Grooms to attend, and the two same footmen on Post Horses.

At Over the Heath four of Figgates Horses to draw the Chaise Hainsworth and the Postilion of the left to ride, Figgates Helper a fresh Hobby Groom, and the same footmen on fresh Post Horses.

At Petersfield four of Figgates Horses the same Postillions and Helper, a fresh Hobby Groom and the four footmen on their own Hacks.

The two Relays to remain where left that they may be ready for Friday
