I have not troubled Y^r
Majesty wth writing till now, having
had nothing new to report respecting
Prince William. He has proceeded in
every respect as I c^d wish ever since
his return, and if at first he did not
show quite so much spirits as at his
first setting out, I can attribute it
only to an increasing affection to his
own Family. His Royal Highness has
for some days been a good deal out of
order with a cold & cough which now
proves to be the Measles and were
very troublesome to him all day.

as well as possible, after the fatigue
of the necessary medicinal discipline
and his cough seems quite gone
off, I shall however persuade him
to take great care of himself for
some time, as I know it is a
disorder that frequently requires
great attention after it is appar-
ently removed.
