Sunday Oct: 4th 1780

Sir

Knowing his Royal Highness
has never omitted writing by every
opportunity, I have not wrote late-
ly to Your Majesty, having so
little to vary in my accounts of
his proceedings. He continues to
be very pleasing to me & very at-
tentive to his learning; Sometimes
he may be a little giddy but I am
persuaded much less so than most
Boys of his age who have not the same
attention paid them, For I must
repeat to Y^r Maj^{ty} that I think
it w^d be impossible to find two more

proper people to be wth him than
 Mr. Injendie & Mr. Waddington,
 The former I am sorry to say, is
 sadly troubled wth head achs, w^{ch}
 have been increas'd by the late
 bad weat. we have had at sea.
 We return'd to Torbay yesterday
 wth y^r whole Fleet except the Sub
 which is I beleive now in sight
 & at present it looks much like
 a southerly wind
