Sir

I received the honor of Your Majesty's letter of ye 26th ult. by the Courier yesterday, & have the pleasure to acquaint Your Majesty, that His Royal Highness seems to have almost entirely got the better of His Cough, which I flatter myself the present fine weather will totally remove in a very few days; but as His Royal Highness complains now as then of a head ache, Dr Zimmerman has recommended to His Royal Highness to continue to take the cooling medicines, which he flatters himself will in a short time correct the overheated state of his blood, & serve to remove any little obstructions which may be the cause of these head aches —
