Since I wrote to you Maj^r
by the Cumberland Packet his Royal
Highness is surprisingly recover'd &
seems to have the perfect use of his
arm tho' still weak. I have again emb-
-ark'd him on board the Warwick altho' it
may probably be some time before I
send her to sea, as I think it better he
sh^d not remain on shore long at a time
and I can find no other proper person
to send him with. Notwithstanding
the Warwick lays in a very disas-
-treable situation without any con-
-nection with y^e shore his M^{ty} seem'd
quite pleas'd at returning on board and
extremely attentive to the little
advice I gave him. Indeed I must say
he always has been so, for his loss of

application and his want of knowing
how to amuse himself cannot properly
be said to be wilfull.

Tho we have accounts of
The French Fleets being arrived at Boston
and said to be in bad condition, I shall
not be easy till I hear of our Fleet from
The West Indies which I do think will
be here in a few days.
