Memorandum from Order Book, of The Kings Jewels.

16331

Packed the Kings Jewels in the presence of Lord Arden, Count
Minister, & M. Gen. Taylor. — The Kings own in His
Majestys old Box, marked G. R. Queen, which Box was
locked and put in the large wainscot Box, marked "The
Kings Jewels" (with Crown) — in this wainscot Box
the Kings G. R. Box was inclosed, together with all the
Jewels belonging to The King, which were in the use of
Her late Majesty Queen Charlotte, in their Cases, as per
Inventories of both annexed. The wainscot Box was
sealed with the Kings Arms upon the Tape in Black
wax. — Delivered at the Bank 15 January 1819. J. B.

N.B. the 7 large Bill^{ts} — Gift of the States
were in a separate Box.

The Kings own Jewels, which were found at the Queens House
on the 7. January 1819. in the Box marked G. R. were as follows.

1 large Bill^t George, set with Brill^{ts} with 8 large Brill^{ts} round, & small.

1 very large Brill^t George, set with Brill^{ts} with some Sapphires, and
Rubies in the Drapery, the back of gold.

1 large Brill^t Star — order of the Sartori
