I have the honour to acquaint Your Majesty, that His Royal Highness returned yesterday evening to this place, after having made a short visit of five days to the Court of Brunswich. His Royal Highness was much mortified to find upon His arrival at Brunswich, that the Dutches had received a letter the very same day from the Prince of Mecklenburg Schwerin, to inform Her Royal Highness that it was out of His power to perform His promise of paying His respects to Her Royal Highness at Brunswich at this season, on account of the overflowing of the Elbe, & the extreme badness of the roads, & that His Highness sh^d be obliged to defer having that honour to some other opportunity.

I have the satisfaction to assure Your Majesty
that His Royal Highness gains more & more
upon the Dukes good opinion, Both the Duke
& Dutches expressed themselves highly sensible
of Your Majesty's goodness in permitting His Royal
Highness to make them this second visit.

Prince Ferdinand was likewise extremely
attentive in taking every opportunity of marking
His Esteem & attachment for the Prince, &
for the whole Royal Family.
