I received the honour of Your Majesty's letter of the 20<sup>th</sup> inst by the Courier Wile, & am extremely happy to have it in my power to send Your Majesty so good an account of the Princes conduct upon all occasions, which cannot fail of affording Your Majesty the highest content & satisfaction.

His Royal Highness sets out tomorrow for Stelich & Schwerin, & proposes being back at this place on 11<sup>th</sup> of July. I am much afraid that His Royal Highness will not have an opportunity of seeing the Imperial troops this year, as I find by a second letter, which I have received from Sr Rob<sup>t</sup> Keith, that there is but very little probability of any Imperial Camps taking place this Autumn. I have likewise received information from Mr Milliquit Your Majesty's

Chargé d'affaires at the Court of Dresden, that  
the Saxon Camps which were to have taken  
place on the 7<sup>th</sup> of September, are countermanded  
& that there will be none this year. as this  
will make some alteration in the first proposed  
plan of our Autumn operations, His Royal Highness  
proposes upon His return to consult with General  
Freytag in regard to another plan which He  
will communicate to Your Majesty for Your Majesty's  
consent & approbation.

I hope Your Majesty will allow me to comply  
with Colonel Melorties request, in laying Him  
at Your Majesty's feet with every sentiment of  
gratitude & thankfulness for the favour Your  
Majesty has lately thought fit to confer upon  
Him in His advancement to the Rank of Colonel.
