Hanover July 28<sup>th</sup> 1783.

I have the satisfaction to acquaint Your Majesty that His Royal Highness has escaped the return of the Ague fit, & is in the fairest way of a quick recovery, The Bark has had the desired effect, & I make not the smallest doubt but that with a little management of Himself for some short time, His Royal Highness will be perfectly cured, & will perhaps enjoy a better state of Health than He has done ever before His illness.

His Royal Highness proposes writing to Your Majesty by the Fridays Carrier, & will take that opportunity to send Your Majesty the plan

which General Freytag has sketched out for  
a tour for His Royal Highness in the Autumn,  
as this plan includes the Courts of Gotha, Capet,  
Hannau, &c. &c. it will greatly clear the way  
for our expedition to the Courts of Vienna & Dresden  
as we shall by these means have only the Courts  
in that neighbourhood to visit. His Royal Highness  
seems rather to be of opinion, that it wd be better  
to postpone the visit to Vienna to next year, when  
He may perhaps have an opportunity of seeing the  
Imperial camps at the same time, but as  
this must depend entirely upon Your Majesty's  
future intentions, His Royal Highness only proposes  
the above plan for Your Majesty's consideration.
