Sir

I am sorry to acquaint Your Majesty that His Royal Highness was on Wednesday taken ill of pretty near the same kind of Bilious intermitting fever, as He had in the summer. His Royal Highness has discharged a great quantity of Bile, which has given Him very considerable relief. I have taken the liberty to send Your Majesty the enclosed paper from Dr Zimmerman, that Your Majesty may be made thoroughly acquainted with the real state of His Royal Highness's Illness. It will require the utmost attention in His Royal Highness after His recovery, to take care of Himself for some time to come, & as He is now quietly settled here, & has the whole winter

before Him, I hope He will be induced to use every method & take every precaution towards reestablishing His health, which I am sorry to say has not been for some time so well, as I could have wished it.

I flatter myself I shall soon be enabled to send Your Majesty a better account of His Royal Highness's state of health, but the ague must have time to discharge itself, before the bark can be properly administered. The very steady application which the Prince gave to His affairs during His short stay at Osnatruck, has gained Him the applause, & good will of all ranks of people there, I should not have failed mentioning this circumstance in my last letter to Your Majesty, but the heavy calamity I have sustained in the loss of my father, an account of which I had just received, when I had lost the manner of writing to Your Majesty, made me forget inserting it; Your Majesty will judge of the weight of my affliction, when it is sufficient to have made me let slip
