It gives me the greatest satisfaction to be able to send Your Majesty the following good account of His Royal Highness. The fever is greatly diminished & continues to decrease daily; the two last fits of Saturday & yesterday were so inconsiderable, particularly that of yesterday, that Doct^r Zimmermann entertains the greatest hopes that His Royal Highness will not have above one or two more at the utmost, & those so trifling as to be hardly perceptible. His Royal Highness bears His confinement with a tolerable degree of patience & I flatter myself He will at last be induced to use more precaution for the future, & to take all possible means to guard against a relapse.
