Lord Southampton's Account of what has past between the P. of Wales and Him is a fresh proof of the bad advice given, or the Pride and Vanity that prevent the P. of Wales from acting as he ought. The letter formally forbidding his going abroad as Father and Sovereign draws to such serious consequences that there is no fear he can be encouraged to disobey it.

Has the P. of Wales any application to make on account of his Debts He ought to state them for my Consideration; indeed that is the only line; for till I know what they amount to and what Security that futures excesses will be prevented; it is impossible for Me to engage in a business of which neither the extent, nor the mode of assistance I am at this minute in the least able to form any opinion.
